



By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries bearing date the twelfth day of July Anno Dom. 1733. There was survey'd for Elizabeth Marsh on the thirtieth day of August 1733, ten acres of land in the liberties of Philadelphia on the West side of Schuylkil. Beginning at a post in the line of William Couch's land & running thence by the sd land East South East fourty perches to a post at a corner of ye sd Couch's land thence South South West fourty p<sup>rs</sup> to a corner marked Hickery thence West North West fourty perches to another corner marked Hickery sapling thence North North East fourty perches to the place of beginning.
