Containing two hundred and fourteen acres and one hundred and twenty perches and allowance &c.

Dear Sir

Enclosed are two returns of Surveys made for Caleb Bailey and Joseph Whitacre. Robert Ashby's claim is relinquished by declaring it to me so, but Robert E. Griffith and Co. is still continued. A Warrant for George Lattimore was handed to me the 5th of March 1810 by Thos. Bewerside Esq. dated Decem^r 1786 No. 407 & with a Location dated the 1st of March 1810, to be surveyed on the river Pinnemooning on the North East side opposite the 2^d fork &c. Joseph Whitacre handed to me a Warrant dated 30th of Jan^y 1810 including an improvement made by John Jordan since May 1804 for most the same spot of ground - finding that the improvement is older than the location entered in my Book, I there accordingly surveyed for Joseph Whitacre, and in my Book of Entry obliterated that the warrant in the name of George Lattimore as entered cannot obliterate the lands of John Jordan's prior improvement, which includes a obliterated with a bump made before the Location of George Lattimore.
