



A Draught of an Island in the River Delaware, called Maxwell's Island, being the second Island, below the forks of the said River at Easton, and lying opposite lands occupied by John Maxwell and Jacob Myers in New Jersey and by - Shumaker, in Pennsylvania, which Island by certain Acts 1717. 1717. and New Jersey, 1717. the limits and Jurisdiction of the State of Pennsylvania as the channell or depth of water is on the East side thereof containing within the bounds thereof at low water mark the quantity of 12 acres and one q^r. of an acre, besides the usual allowance of six p^{er} Cent. Surveyed the 19th day of February 1788. for Brigadier General, William Maxwell Esq^r. in pursuance of a special Warrant Granted by the Honorable the Proprietaries unto John Thompson for the quantity of one thousand acres, dated the 10th day of September 1744 and an order of Survey from the Surveyor, Genl. to said Warrant annexed Surveyed by, Chas.
