N.B. The part marked disputed by Jones & Wells is claimed by Virtue of an Improvement said to be  
 made a certain Deaqol, they obtained a Warrant for the same with a quantity adjacent dated  
 26<sup>th</sup> May 1792 dating their interest back to 1<sup>st</sup> March 1788, the other part is disputed by  
 Robert Goans by virtue of his Warrant dated 1<sup>st</sup> March 1793.

I have endeavored to settle the controversy by going on the ground and hearing the  
 allegations of the parties, but the controversy is of such a nature I cannot decide, it will  
 therefore of course be laid before the honorable Board of Property, preparatory to which I  
 forward this; and will by the earliest opportunity forward the surveys of Goans and Jones &  
 Wells for whom I have surveyed the same land on their Rights of their particular Request in order  
 to show the land in contest more distinctly. a full representation of which I am  
 yet prepared to make, neither can I do it in such a manner as I would wish, without  
 going on the ground again. I am directed to request that no Patent may  
 issue until the parties are heard.
