 We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claims to unpatented Lands in the Counties of Monongalia, Yohogania and Ohio do hereby certify that Thomas Brown is entitled to four hundred acres of land in the Counties of Monongalia & Yohogania to include his Settlement purchased of William Colvin near Redstone old Fort made in the year of our lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty three—
