



To Surveyor General of Pennsylvania.

Sir: I transmit the above plan or draft of improved land surveyed by me on the second day of March A.D. 1865, in pursuance of a Warrant issued on the 11 day of January 1865 by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for Joseph B. Dobbs, containing 220 Acres and 68 perches and allowance of six per cent.

Situate in Jenkins township, Forest County, Pa. which land had been improved since the first day of May 1848, but has not had any person residing thereon for more than two years last past, being the south eastern southern portion of a larger tract of land containing 276^{ac} & 137 perches and allowance of which this piece now located and returned is a part being bounded as described as above.
