The above draught represents a survey made of a part of a tract of land for which Abraham Enlow obtained a warrant calling for 200<sup>Ac</sup> bearing date Dec<sup>r</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 1795. Situate in Lindley Township Washington Co. Called Black Oak. The part above Represented, is the part claimed by the heirs of Henry Enlow and for which Henry Enlow's Executors has made application for to obtain a patent. The black lines represents the work on the ground, and the red ones the return made of the Survey by the deputy originally, which part we think is not correct. I also give the variation found on the lines between the original and present surveys. The above contains 37<sup>Ac</sup> 39<sup>r</sup> 19<sup>p</sup> and the usual allowance of six per cent.
