



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietors Comm^s Dated the 5th of a^y 9th mo. 1714. I surveyed unto William Beal a certain Tract of Land ^{North} of Nottingham in a^y County of Chester Beginning at a post at a Corner of John Graftons Land thence South by Vacant Land fifty six perches to a Post thence East by a line of marked Trees two Hundred and twelve perches to a White Oak thence North East by North by Vacant Land Two Hundred & two perches to a Hickory thence North West by Vacant Land one Hundred & fifty perches to a Post thence South West by Vacant Land & the Land of the s^d John Grafton three Hundred & four perches to the place of Beginning - Containing ~~three~~ three Hundred Acres - with allowance of Six p^{ct} Cent
