



Begin at 1 a Locust post on the North West Bank of the Ohio River where the Pennsylvania and Ohio State Line crosses the River.

2. a Locust post in the edge of Little Beaver Creek at a corner of land surveyed for George M. Cornick and Patented to Job Harvey.

3. a Locust post on the West bank of Little Beaver Creek. The courses from 1 to 2 and 2 to 3 are up on the next above mentioned line of lands.

4. a Locust post on the North West side of the Ohio River at Low water mark just above the mouth of Little Beaver; and the line from 3 to 4 is bounded by land of George Dawson.

5. Black walnut post at Low water mark on the North West side of Ohio River.

6. Do. Do. Do. Do.

7. Do. Do. Do. Do. from 7 to 1 on the State line.

The triangle formed by the black and dotted lines, and contained in the Letters A and B and figure 4, and carved out of the

thereon but without buildings ^{is} in possession of Geo.
