



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietor Dated the 9<sup>th</sup> Day of June Anno Domini 1736 The above Tract of Land <sup>Situate in Robinsons Township in Lancaster County</sup> was Surveyed unto Francis Hughes Beginning at a white tree by the River Schuylkill Thence South (3 Degrees East) by the Land of Caleb Harrison 162 perches to a Spanish Oak Thence South West by the Settlement of Victor Nealy 80 perches to a Hickory Thence North 60 Degrees West by <sup>Land</sup> of Victor Nealy Vacant & the Land of John Scarlet 216 p. to a White oak Thence North 30 Degrees East by Land Surveyed for Samuel Robinson 103 pches to a Chestnut tree Thence Down the said River on the Several Courses thereof 200 perches to a place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred Acres beside the Allowance of Sixty Cent for Roads
