



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietary's Commissioners dated the 23^d day of ^{Sept} Hebru^{ry} in the year 1702. There was Survey'd on the 7th day of April 1703. unto Joseph Cloud, his Proportion of headland (being fifty acres) situate in the Township of Calu in the County of Chester.

Beginning at a Black Oak being a corner of James Wood and William Lovell's Land. Thence West by the same Land 400 perches to a White Oak thence West by South 13 perches to a Hickory by the North branch of Brandywine Creek then down the same South 54^d East 50 perches to a White Oak thence North 87^d East by a line of marked trees 376 perches to a black oak thence North by vacant Land ten perches to the place of Beginning.
