Pursuant to an Order of the Board of Property dated the 18th day of April 1803 on the petition of James Burns said to be the purchaser of a Tract of land Granted to Samuel Beard by Warrant dated the 24th of March 1789 - Bounded by lands of John Mitchell and others and Survey^d under Special Order from the Board to William Power - dated 22 Jan^y 1790.

On the 6th of July 1803 and the 24th of April 1804 - Resurvey^d the part N^o 3 shown on the above Draught agreeable to the boundaries of a Survey made by W^m Power on the 22^d of Feb^r 1790 - at the request of Sam^l Beard which appears to contain One hundred and Forty nine Acres and 106 perches and the allowance of Six pr. Cent for roads &c - On the 17th day of August 1803 - Resurvey^d the part N^o 1 which appears to contain Sixty six acres and 56 perches and the allowance of Six pr. cent for roads - agreeable to the lines run by said Power including four acres and 152 perches &c which was vacant and is shown by the part Coloured Green - N. B. The whole of the ab ds included in the Parts N^o 1 and 3 appears to be Two hundred and sixteen acres ab 2 perches and the allow^{ce} 9^c

A dwelling house and some App^l trees with about three or four ab of Cleared mow occupied by Widow Agnes Crampton she claims ab the land Eastrd of a dotted line thro the above Draught from a W. O. falls to a post on line bearing N. 58. E - by virtue of an old improvement (formerly Call^d Ludmores) and a Warrant in her name for 120 acres dated January 21st 1804 -
