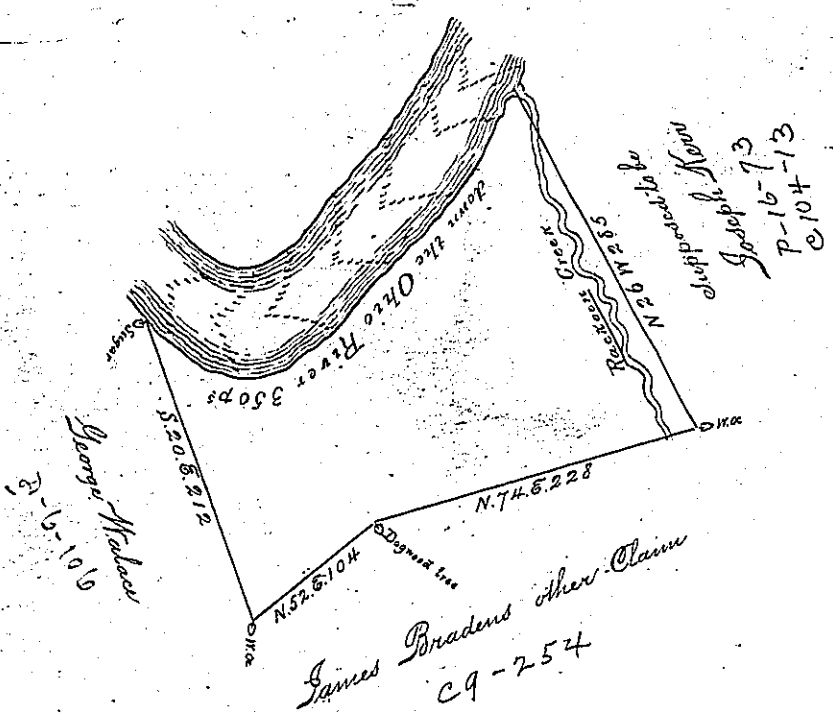

The above is a Survey made April 10th 1785 for James Braden in pursuance of the following worded Certificate To wit. Virginia Surveyors Office Yohogania County Ss. James Braden produced a Certificate from the Com^{rs} appointed to adjust Claims to unappropriated Lands in the Counties of Yohogania Monongalia and Ohio for four hundred Acres of Land in this County on Raccoon Creek to include his settlement made in the year 1776 which was entered April 3^d 1780. 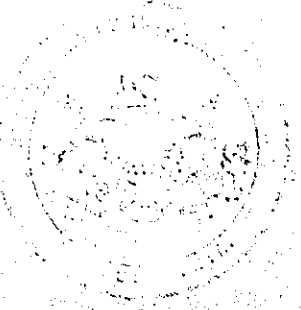

A Ticket sent on this 13th Dec^r. 87 it being laid before a Bd^y of Prop^y by Genl Nevill this Res^d ordered to be Pat^d by order of Bd^y of Property Octo^r 1788. Agreeable to the last received res^d of the Board of Property Sec^y that the above does not suit the Description of the Certificate for altho the lands lie on Raccoon Creek it likewise lies on Ohio River which the Com^{rs} would not have omitted mentioning in all probability. - the Certif^c answers well to the Land on which James Braden lives higher up the Creek and this is the Warrant granted by the Commonwealth to Samuel Held a
