



I Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in the little Cove in the County of Bedford containing One hundred and eighty seven Acres with the usual Allowance of six p<sup>ts</sup> Cent for Roads &c<sup>d</sup> Surveyed for John Jacques the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1786. In pursuance of a Warrant Dated August 20<sup>th</sup> 1785.
