The dotted lines represent part of a Survey made for Joseph Hollingshead on order N<sup>o</sup> 1414 dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1766 - this tract interferes one hundred and sixty four acres with the Joseph Baymer Survey - Joseph Hollingshead conveyed to Baynton Wharton & Morgan \_\_\_\_\_ who claimed under Joseph Baymer - the title descended from them to Michael F. Simpson who conveyed to George Fetters - who conveyed to Thomas Snyder the present owner

The red lines represent part of the draught of a survey made for Thomas L. Dumm on warrant dated the 21<sup>st</sup> day of February 1793 this survey interferes nine acres and fifty five perches with the Joseph Baymer Survey - Joseph Baymer conveyed to Baynton Wharton & Morgan from whom the title descended to Michael F. Simpson - who conveyed to John Wolliday to whom Thomas L. Dumm had conveyed - John Wolliday conveyed to James May and the present owner
