Started from pine stump South East corner of the certified township of Exeter - Thence along the line between said township and the certified township of Pittston S 79 W 24 p<sup>er</sup> x small stream pt. Lt 58. Vandoren house close to Rt - 60 x coal brook pt Lt - 120 x Stream pt Lt 141.1 to a pine corner formerly of Joseph Worsfield's now Jacob Good's land - Thence along his line N 5 W 32 x road - 38 x last mentioned stream pt Lt 170 made a pine corner - Thence by land supposed Vacant N 79 E 74 x coal brook pt Lt 116 made chest. sap pt corner in the line of Andrew Henderson's land - Thence by s<sup>th</sup> Henderson's land S 16 W 80 x coal brook pt Lt 112 to a pine corner made on a resurvey of s<sup>th</sup> Henderson's lot - Thence also by said Henderson's land N 89 E 114 x last brook pt Lt made a Stake and Stones in the east line of Exeter Certified township - Thence along said town line S 79 W 59 p<sup>er</sup> to Beginning
