



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date of 15 Day of May 1729 There was Surveyed to Clement Plumsted in Right of Abel Struttell a certain Tract or Parcel of Land situate on the Northern branches of Cooksing Creek in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a corner mark'd white Oak standing at the North-east corner of the Widow Rambo's Wheat field Thence North sixty degrees Easterly by Vacant Land one hundred & ninety one Perches to a Post; Thence North west by Vacant Land Two hundred & Eighty one Perches to a Post; Thence South west by Vacant Land Two hundred seventy four perches to a Post; Thence South east by Vacant Land Two hundred thirty two Perches to a Post; Thence North east Crossing the said Wheat field Ninety Perches to the place of Beginning: Containing four hundred Acres and the Allorance of six Acres p cent & Surveyed the 1st Day of Decem^r 1730
