N^o 1 represented by dotted lines is a Draft of a tract of Land surveyed for John Ormsby on order N^o 3177 dated the 25th day of March 1767 - This tract interferes one Hundred and thirteen acres and ninety seven perches with the Joseph Reed survey - John Ormsby conveyed to Ephraim Blaine who conveyed to Lewis Turner the present owner.

N^o 2 represented by dotted lines is a draft of a Tract of land surveyed for Henry Frigs on Warrant dated the 28th day of May 1766. - This tract interferes Fifty Eight acres and seventy perches with the Joseph Reed tract - Henry Frigs conveyed to Samuel Wallace who conveyed to George Woods who conveyed to Lewis Turner the present owner.

N^o 3 represented by one dotted and one dash and scour lines is a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for William Lafferty on Warrant dated the 16th day of May 1793 - This tract interferes seven acres with the Joseph Reed survey - this tract was sold from William Lafferty by the Sheriff of Bedford County to John Tod who conveyed to Henry Beltz the present owners - The green and dotted lines represent part of a Draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Robert Thompson on warrant dated the 7th day of July 1762 - this tract interferes Twenty Three acres and twenty nine perches with the Joseph Reed survey - Robert Thompson conveyed to Daniel Clark and William Peters - William Peters conveyed his moiety thereof to Dr William Smith whose heirs now claim the land - Daniel Clark conveyed to Milford & Roberts and to the firm of Neate & Regew - the heirs of Milford & Roberts now claim part of said tract - Neate & Regew conveyed to William Neate whose heirs now claim part of said tract.

N^o 4 represented by dotted lines is a part of a tract of Land surveyed for Matthew Taylor on Warrant dated the 5th day of July 1811 - This tract interferes Twenty acres and twenty perches with the Joseph Reed survey - Matthew Taylor conveyed to George Woods who conveyed to James Taylor the present owner.
