The purple colored lines represent the draught of a tract of Land surveyed for Thomas Blain on Warrant dated the 16th day of January 1790. This tract interferes one Hundred and twenty five acres with the James Scott survey. Thomas Blain conveyed to John Blain Esq and Alexander Blain the present owners.

No 1 represented by dotted lines, is the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Peter Ferry on order No. 396, dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes one Hundred and seventy two acres and ninety five perches with the James Scott survey. Peter Ferry conveyed to John Baynton Samuel Wharton & George Morgan from whom it descended to Michael F. Simpson who conveyed to John Holiday who conveyed to James Alexander the present owner.

No 2 represented by dotted lines is the draught of a tract of land surveyed for William Forsythe on order No. 402 dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes One Hundred and fifty six acres and thirty perches with the James Scott survey. William Forsythe conveyed to John Baynton Samuel Wharton & George Morgan from whom it descended to M. F. Simpson who conveyed to Thomas Blain who devised the same to John & Alexander Blain the present owners.

No 3 represented by dotted lines is part of the Draught of a tract of land surveyed for Solomon Singer on order No 403 dated the 1st day of August 1766. This tract interferes Twenty five acres and eighty five perches with the James Scott survey. Solomon Singer conveyed to John Baynton Samuel Wharton & George Morgan. John Baynton's interest was sold to Michael F. Simpson by the Sheriff of Westmoreland County. George Morgan conveyed to Benjamin Wyncoop who conveyed to Michael F. Simpson. Samuel Wharton's interest was sold by his assignee Benjamin Wyncoop to Michael F. Simpson. Michael F. Simpson conveyed to Francis Smith the present owner.
