



Situate in Bell Township Clearfield County Containing fourteen Acres and thirty eight & one half perches and the usual allowance of six per cent for roads & adjoining lands of John Hart on the East the West Branch of the River Susquehanna & Wm. Smith on the South South & West & John Nicholson on the North. Surveyed on the 2nd July & the 30th & 31st December 1840 for John P. Hoyt. by virtue of his warrant for thirteen acres dated the 5th July 1839. Moses Boggs. D.S.

To Jacob Sallade Esquire S. G.

Note. I commenced this Survey on the 2 July 1840 and traced the old line from the P. O. on the West Branch of the Susquehanna River N. 25 1/2 E 19 pps to Nick's dead & N. 8 W. in part had to postpone the Survey for want of proper dates and on the 30th & 31st December 1840 James Moore finished the survey being deputed by me for that purpose.

On the 2nd July when I commenced the survey there was a cabin raised to the square no rafters or covering. had been raised some 8 or 10 years ago no other improvement on the premises. And on the 30th Dec^r 1840 there was a door cut in the logs with a shutter and a padlock on it. The underbrush cut & grubbed off about one acre with a few trees also a few cut down. Moses Boggs.
