

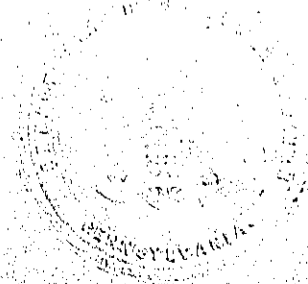

In Pursuance of two Warrants one Granted to Thomas Johnston for 50<sup>ac</sup> dated the 28<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1749. the other to John Winter for 50<sup>ac</sup> dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May A.D. 1762. And now at the request of the Heirs of John Laird deceased, the present owners, the above has been calculated examined and found to be correct, the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August A.D. 1811, and at their request returned for Confirmation.
