



Situate on the Waters of Vineyard or Crooked Creek in Wood Creek Valley in Porter Township, Huntingdon County - containing three hundred and forty Eight acres and allowance of six per Cent. Surveyed for Robert Cooper on Order N<sup>o</sup> 1584 dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day of October 1766.

N<sup>o</sup> 1 represents a survey made for Arthur Parks on Order N<sup>o</sup> 659 dated the 1<sup>st</sup> August 1766 - this survey interferes two hundred and seven acres with the Robert Cooper tract - Arthur Parks conveyed to George Reynolds - whose heirs conveyed to John Patton Esqr the present owner - Pat<sup>o</sup>

N<sup>o</sup> 2 represents part of a survey made for John Meener on Warrant dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of July 1762. This survey interferes Thirty acres and one hundred and forty two perches with the Robert Cooper Survey - John Meener conveyed to John Baynton, Samuel Wharton & George Morgan who conveyed to Richard Neave & Son who conveyed to John Patton the present owner.

N<sup>o</sup> 3 represents part of a survey made for John Patton on Warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1811. This survey interferes fifty seven acres with the Robert Cooper survey - John Patton is the present owner.

N<sup>o</sup> 4 represents part of a survey made for George Reynolds on Warrant dated the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November 1774 - this survey interferes thirty one acres and seventy five perches with the Robert Cooper survey - George Reynolds - devised the same to his heirs who conveyed to John Patton Esqr the present owner.
