N. B. The above Described Tract of Land is Held, and Disputed by Andrew Campbell & George Ritter, who say they have a Legal Claim to the same, but as there is no Marked line to be found Between the Lands Held by s<sup>d</sup> Campbell and Ritter, and the Land of s<sup>d</sup> James Henderson, the s<sup>d</sup> Henderson Insisted on Having a Parallel line Run of s<sup>d</sup> Campbells Tract, agreeable to a Draught made by Tho<sup>s</sup> Lightfoot, by which the above Described Tract of Land would fall into the s<sup>d</sup> Hendersons Warrant agreeable to the above survey. The s<sup>d</sup> Henderson also Insisted of Having a Return made of the same, to the Surveyor Generals Office, in Order to have a hearing Before Board of Property - Con Concerning the Premises. The said Henderson brought heretofore an Ejectment against s<sup>d</sup> Campbell and Ritter for s<sup>d</sup> Land, which is now depending in the Supreme Court, which the s<sup>d</sup> Campbell and Ritter Requested of me to mention to you.
