



Situate in the River Susquehanna Called Bald Eagle Containing three acres and twenty seven perches of Land and the usual allowance &c Surveyed In Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to Rudolph Spangler for three acres - bearing date the 28th day of September 1802 - the Courses and distances of which are as follows viz. Beginning at a Post where this mark is placed in the above diagram extending thence up the said River North twenty nine degrees West fourteen perches, North twenty degrees west twenty eight Perches North Eleven degrees East twenty perches, thence Down the same South fifty nine degrees east nine perches, South two degrees and one quarter east twenty six perches, South twenty eight degrees east thirty four perches and thence North sixty eight degrees west ten perches to the Place of Beginning Containing 3^{ac} & 27^{pc} & allow^d along^d and being about one fourth of a Mile from Matthias Spes Land in York County and westward of Barthram Galbraith Island about fifteen perches therefrom
