



Surveyed the above described tract of land the 18th & 19th days of December 1837 for Simeon Plutz by virtue of his Warrant for 400 acres dated 8th April 1837 Containing four hundred acres with the allowance of six per Cent for roads &c. Situate on Kettle Creek about nine miles from its mouth in Chapman Township Lycoming County & bounded as above described

Note the above interferes with a Survey on a Warrant granted to John Baird dated 22nd September 1830. I objected to interfere with Baird's Survey. S. Plutz said his lines were marked on the ground before Baird's Survey was made. & he forbid him executing his Warrant when he did.
