W. 20 per to a black oak by the said creek Thence up the same Creek on several Courses about 60 perches to a Post Thence crossing the same Creek S. 60 W. 17 per to a Post Thence by Land of Henry Bantelstall N. W. 31 1/2 per to a Post near a marked black oak Thence N. E. 108 per to a Post Thence by Land late of John Parker S.
