



N<sup>o</sup> 1. A survey situate on the waters of Raccoon creek, containing <sup>A. R. P.</sup> 300<sup>0</sup> 3<sup>1</sup> 14 and the allowance executed February 14<sup>th</sup> 1787 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Daniel Swearingen for 300 acres, dated September 8<sup>th</sup> 1785.

N<sup>o</sup> 2. A survey situate on the waters of Raccoon creek, containing <sup>A. R. P.</sup> 293<sup>0</sup> 3<sup>1</sup> 14 and the allowance executed February 14<sup>th</sup> 1787 in pursuance of a warrant granted to Henry Willson and assigned to Samuel Moore, for 300 acres dated September 2<sup>o</sup> 1785.

N.B. These returns are wrong - N<sup>o</sup> 1 ought to have been returned on Willson's warrant, and N<sup>o</sup> 2 on the warrant granted to Daniel Swearingen.
