



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second Day of October A^d 1735 Surveyed unto David Evans A Certain Tract of Land situate on the West side of a Branch of Tulpehocken Creek, called Mill Creek, in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Post in Line of George Prigel's Land Thence by the same and vacant Land North East by East half a Easterly One Hundred fifty seven perches and a Half to a small Hickory marked Thence by vacant Land North North West half a Point Westerly Seventy eight perches to a Post Thence by Paltzer Courtway's Settlement South West by West half a Point westerly thirty two perches to a Post and North North West half a Point westerly forty Perches to a Post Thence by Ludwick Plumm's Settlement South West by West half a point Westerly One hundred and seventeen perches and a Quarter to a small Hickory marked in a Line of Leonard Holdston's Land Thence by the same South South East eighty perches to a post at a Corner of 1st Holdston's Land Thence by vacant Land South South East half a Point Easterly thirty eight perches and a Quarter to the place of Beginning Containing One hundred acres and the usual Allowance for Roads &c.
