



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 25th Day of October Anno Domini 1734 for Surveying unto George Groff Two hundred acres of Land adjoining Land he purchased of James Logan on Mill Creek there was surveyed unto the said George Groff ^{in part of 200 hundred acres} Two Tracts of Land. One of them Beginning at a Post in a Line of his other Land Thence extending along the said Line North 55 Deg^s East Ninety three p^{ches} to a Post Thence by Peter Belter's Land North 35 Deg^s West 127 p^{ches} to a Post Thence by vacant Land South 60 Deg^s West 81 p^{ches} to a marked Hickory Thence by vacant Land South 30 Deg^s East 135 p^{ches} to the place of Beginning Containing Sixty seven acres & an allowance of 66 feet for Roads &c. And the other of them Beginning at a Post at a Corner of Christopher Stump's Land Thence extending by the said George Groff's other Land North 44 Deg^s East 74 1/2 p^{ches} to a black oak marked Thence by vacant Land North thirty four Deg^s West 99 p^{ches} to a Post Thence by vacant Land South 56 Deg^s West 73 p^{ches} to a White oak marked Thence by the s^d Christopher Stump's Land South 34 Deg^s East 114 p^{ches} to the place of Beginning Containing Five & forty acres & fifty six p^{ches} and the like all for Roads &c. Surveyed y^e 21st Day of June 1739
