By Virtue of two of the Heirs Proprietaries Warrants Dated the 4<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1743 each to the said Peter Dicks and another Warr<sup>t</sup> to Stephen Ulrich Dated Novem<sup>r</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> 1743 assigned to the said Peter Dicks Survey'd the 20<sup>th</sup> of April 1744

S<sup>r</sup> Peter Dicks on discovering some Iron Ore which he had a Mind to improve took out two Warr<sup>ts</sup> for 100<sup>ac</sup> each and Stephen Ulrich having a Warr<sup>t</sup> for 100<sup>ac</sup> at the same place he bought that and thereupon had the above Quantity Survey'd by George Smith without prejudice to any body's right as the warrants on the 2 sides may shew Now I fancy Mr Peter will on this give a Warr<sup>t</sup> to accept this Survey on y<sup>e</sup> three Warr<sup>ts</sup> and the payment of 5<sup>00</sup> a hundred for y<sup>e</sup> Ore plus which you can readily do for him I hope to see you the week after next I am y<sup>r</sup> most assured ready hble Serv<sup>t</sup> Tho. Cookson
