I James J. Hoge Deputy Surveyor in and for the County of Butler in the State of Pennsylvania do hereby certify that I have examined the tract of land on which Peter McKenny Esq. resides in Connaquenessing township - County & State aforesaid being the same for which he is now applying for a patent or mortgage & that from the books or documents in my office said tract does not appear to have been granted or surveyed to any person other than said Applicant by warrant or otherwise - that the diagram herewith appended is a true copy of the survey of said tract as made by Barnet Gilleland Esq. - then Deputy Surveyor in the year 1820 Mayth - also I do hereby certify that I have examined those parts of said tract - which were sold to B. Gilleland and John Ray - and also the balance of said tract - being that part upon which the said Peter - now resides - and have no hesitation in saying that the latter - from its location & improvements is more than sufficient to secure the payment of the balance of the purchase money & put due the State from said piece or balance of land.
