



The above is a draught of a survey executed December 14<sup>th</sup> 1818 situate on the fork of Charliers creek in Strabane township Washington county; containing in both compartments (represented by the letters A & B and included in the yellow boundary) two hundred and one acres, and twenty two perches and the usual all<sup>e</sup> being the same which was lately partitioned and set apart, out of a certain body of lands now called Morgans to Thomas Morgan Esq.

The above survey is composed of a part of two original surveys the compartment marked B is part of a tract of land surveyed for Robert Harrison November 3<sup>d</sup> 1769 in pursuance of an Order N<sup>o</sup> 548 dated 3<sup>d</sup> of April 1769 called Norfolk situate on the West side of the Monongahela containing 27.3 acres 3 rods, and 33 per & all<sup>e</sup>. This tract (Harrisons) you readily perceive from the return is bounded by the S.E. branch of Charliers creek of which the compartments in my return marked B contains 92 acres & 88 perches & all<sup>e</sup>.

The other marked A, contains 108 acres and 94 perches & all<sup>e</sup> and is part of a tract surveyed for William Preston by Order N<sup>o</sup> 517 1769 called Leicesster, situate on the West side of the Monongahela river containing 374 ac<sup>ts</sup> with all<sup>e</sup> and is situate on the West branch of Charliers creek; the boundary line between this tract and that of Rob<sup>t</sup> Harrison is represented by the dotted line passing through the part which I now return bearing S 52° W - 282 per.
