



Pursuant to the instructions and directions from the Surveyor General's Office dated June 4<sup>th</sup> 1846\* Therewith Returns for Patenting the above lot marked in the above plan "John Rice" situate in the City of Philadelphia on the East side of Delaware Sixth Street. Commencing on the North side of a public alley called Mulberry Alley between Vine and Sassafras Streets thence running Eastward along the North line of said Mulberry Alley and at right angles with said Sixth Street fifty two feet six inches thence running Northward parallel with said Sixth Street eighteen feet thence running Eastward at Right angles with said Sixth Street forty six feet six inches thence running Northward parallel with said Sixth Street Thirty feet six inches thence Running Westward at Right angles with said Sixth Street ninety nine feet to said Sixth Street and thence running Southward along the East side of said Sixth Street forty eight feet six inches to the place of beginning. Bounded on the North by ground now or late of William Warner Eastward by ground of \_\_\_\_\_ Southward partly by said Mulberry Alley and partly by ground of \_\_\_\_\_ and Westward by Sixth Street aforesaid.
