



Draft of a tract of land situate in Towamensing township Carbon County (formerly Northampton) containing three hundred and twenty one acres and a quarter and allowance &c. Surveyed the 23^d April 1794 by virtue of a Warrant dated 26th April 1793 by George Palmer Dep Surveyor to Peter Berninger which tract has since been divided as shown by the dotted line crossing the same bearing N 67³/₄ E 171.5 perches. That part of the tract north of the division line contains one hundred and sixty acres, one hundred and nine perches & all^c &c. and is owned by the Heirs of George Beer dec^d. - that part of the tract south of the division line contains one hundred and sixty acres ninety one perches & all^c.

The above draft is copied from an official survey, the division line plotted and calculation made of contents at the request of Daniel Wentz Adm^r &c. of George Beer deceased who has made an application at the land office for a Patent for that part now owned by the Heirs of said George Beer.
