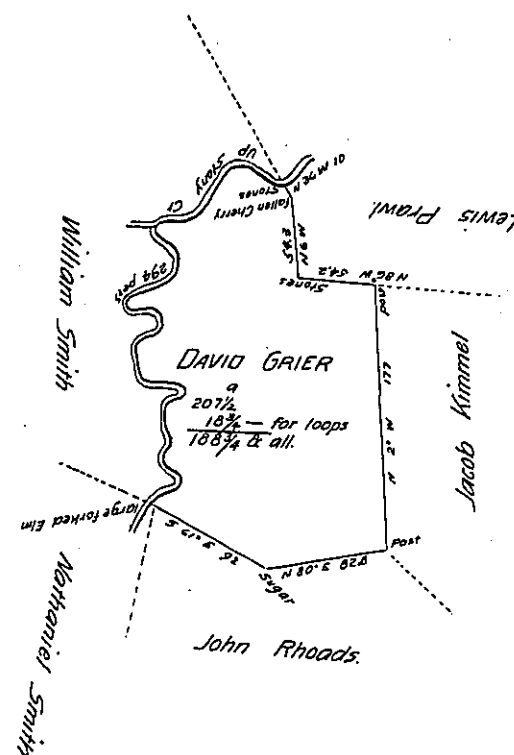

Situated on the East side of Stoney Creek in Quernahoning formerly Brothers Valley Township Bedford County and Surveyed the 26th day of September 1786. And Returned into the Surveyor Generals Office in Consequence of a Warrant dated 5th Aug^r 1773 for 200 Acres granted to said Grier on both sides of Paul Dewits run in Standing Stone Valley adjoining Meadow made by said Paul Dewit and to extend up the Run North from the said Meadow or near that Course in the County of Bedford, which land had been surveyed and Returned to John Miller in Pursuance of an Order of Survey dated 10th October 1766 Numbered 1491 as appears by a Certificate of William Maclay dated 5th September 1774, entered on the back of said Warrant and directed to John Lukens Esquire Surveyor General.- And in pursuance of the Orders of the Surveyor General inserted on the back of said Warrant and to me directed of which the following is a true copy.

Surveyor Generals Office 31st of Sept^r 1774.- To Alexander McClean Esq^r Surveyor in Brothers Vally Township- David Grier obtained a Warrant for two hundred acres of Land which the within is a Copy who applied to have the same Surveyed, found the same had been taken up as appears by Wm. Maclay's Certificate thereon, said Grier by Deed dated the 11th day of September 1773 Convey'd his Right and Title of s^d Warrant to George Irvine of York town Merchant who desires the same may be laid out on a Tract of Land Situate in Brothers Valley Top supposed to Contain about three hundred acres which s^d Irvine purchased of the then passessor George ^{Funk} of Bedford County Yeoman by Deed Poll bearing date the 16th day of Sept^r 1773 as doth appear adjoining lands of Henry Rhoades and Henry Miller on the Waters of Stoney Creek in Brothers Valley Top aforesaid.- Please to survey and make return thereof into my office as soon as possible
