



The above is a draught of a survey made the 24<sup>th</sup> of January 1818, in pursuance of a warrant dated March 8<sup>th</sup> 1817, situate Buffalo township, Washington county containing twelve acres and sixty one perches with the usual allowance.

The heirs of David <sup>Reedick</sup> claim the whole of the above survey, and have cleared land many years ago as far as Hoges line, which is well marked as mentioned above. The lines appear to correspond nearly where the off-sets are made at the ends of the two long lines, the difference in the course being only 2° in the original surveys, and now 2° on account of the variation, their lengths being the same in the original

The claim of Mr. Eaton appears to depend on the following facts: first that in the original surveys there was a difference of 4° between ~~that~~ the course of Mr. Hoges line and that of Mr. Reedick, the former being 66° (now 65½) and the latter 70° - and in the second place Reedick's adjoining Mr. Reed being too long by 11 perches, thereby making Reedick more land than his original claim which is really the case - On the whole however, I am inclined to believe, that it was Reedick's intention to claim as far as the marked line adjoining Mr. Hoges
