



Situate on the south side of Juniata River and E. W. Side of Jacks mountain in formerly Cooperwell Town Union township, Hunt-  
 ington County. Containing two Hundred and forty eight acres and allowance of six per Cent. Surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 1775 for Gideon  
 Koller on order No. 2266 dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of December 1766

The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Thomas Bell on Warrant dated the 5<sup>th</sup> day of March  
 1794 This tract interferes forty acres and thirty six perches with the Gideon Koller survey. Thomas Bell conveyed to John Brown who  
 appears to have abandoned his claim to this land.

The red lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for John Bayles on Warrant dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> January 1794  
 This tract interferes one Hundred and eighteen acres and one hundred and twenty six perches with the Gideon Koller survey John Bayles  
 conveyed to John Covenhoven who conveyed to John Young who devised to Samuel Young the present owner
