



Situate on the West Side of the Raystown Branch of Juniata—in Hopewell township Huntingdon County containing two Hundred and Seventy one Acres and allowance. Surveyed for John Owens Jr. on Order No. 332 dated the 1st. day of August 1766.

The dotted lines represent the draught of a tract of Land Surveyed for Jno. M^r Math on order No. 1214 dated the 13th. September 1766 - This tract interferes with the John Owens Survey Two Hundred and one acres - John M^r Math sold to John Foshee and Benjamin Kidd, John Foshee conveyed his Moitey to Benjamin Kidd, who devised the whole tract to John Kidd who conveyed to Jacob Didiwiler who conveyed to Jacob Grub whose Widow and Heirs now own and occupy the same.

The green lines and river represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Andrew Simpson on order No. 1461 dated the 10th. day of October 1766 - This tract interferes One hundred and Seventy Six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ with the John Owens survey - Andrew Simpson conveyed to Richard Tea Esqr. who appears to have abandoned his title to this Survey.
