



By Virtue of a Proprietary Warrant dated the 23rd Day of November Anno Dom 1737 for laying out two hundred
 Acres of Land ^{to Benja. Webb} on Little Swatara Creek in the County of Lancaster I have surveyed A Certain Tract of Land in the sd County
 Beginning at a Post near a marked Hickry on the West Side of the said Creek Thence crossing the Creek South 55 Deg^s

 post Thence North West 72 pches to a post on the South Side of the said Creek all the a^d Courses & Distances by vacant Land
 Thence along the sd Creek on several Courses 232 pches Thence crossing ye Creek 8 pches to a black oak marked on ye West
 Side thereof Thence along ye ^{same 162} pches To the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred thirty two Acres & a quarter with an
 allowance of 6 pCt. for Roads &c. Surveyed the 9th Decemr. 1737
