*Note, this Survey was much Controverted at the time of making by reason of the long delay of execution and the encroachments of Settlers, the Controversy between the States respecting Jurisdiction preventing from rigorous measures in Case of opposition, A Suit in Ejectment for a part thereof is now depending. And <sup>the Residue</sup> may probably be submitted to the Honorable Board of Property, in Order to determine the Right to Patent. For the Assistance of the Board in Comprehending the Situation of the Several Claims I have pointed them out <sup>in</sup> and about the Draught prospectively, the time when and other attendant Circumstances I have to the Evidence of such as may be called thereto.*
