



Annexed are the Draughts of two Parcels of Land belonging to Roger Kirk, The one containing 46 1/2% & allowance, In Right of Richard Stedman Survey'd by my Father J. C. the 9<sup>th</sup> of the 5. mo. 1745, In Pursuance of a Warrant granted to said R. Stedman the 8<sup>th</sup> day of the month called February 1744/5. Situate as above ment<sup>d</sup>. The other called Kirk's Mill Priviledge containing 36 1/4% & allowance, including the Mill Pond &c, Being Part of a Tract <sup>of about 2500</sup> Survey'd for John Grafton the 19<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>nd</sup> mo. 1716, In Pursuance of a Warrant bearing Date the 5<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> mo. 1714 — which was afterwards Purchased by Arthur Barrett, & by him sold to Mordecai James &c. &c, the same was divided into several Parts the 11<sup>th</sup> of the 2<sup>nd</sup> mo. 1761
