

Having ascertained where the land lay that is held by John Kenedy's Warrant I called on Josiah Lowrey and wife the assignees of John Kenedy and agreed with them on a day to proceed to survey their land ^{before} the affixed time arrived Mr. Lowrey presented me with a document of which the following is a true copy and desired me to transmit the same to the land office

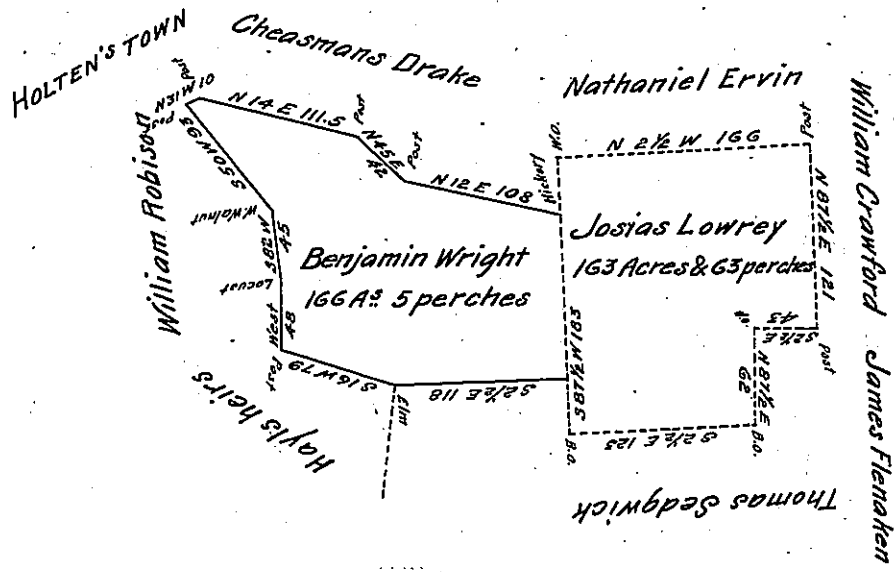

Ejectment

Rule that John Gapen be appointed an artist to survey and ascertain the boundaries and note the interferences of the claims to the land the subject of the present Ejectment upon ten days notice given to Joseph Lowry.



In testimony that the above is a true extract from the records of the Court of Common Pleas of Greene County I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of my office at Waynesburg the second day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine

In obedience to the above Rule of Court I surveyed the lands of the parties and ascertained the boundaries as is exhibited in the above draught and find no interference in the boundaries. The lines of Josias Lowry's land are represented by dotted lines and the boundaries of Benjamin Wright's land by straight lines

I do certify that the above is a true Copy of a Draught and other matters presented to me by Josias Lowry with a request that the same be transmitted to the Surveyor General's office. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 9th day of May 1828

P.S. Mr. Josias Lowry is the son-in-law of John Kenedy and in possession (as he states) of 160 Acres of the land granted to John Kenedy by warrant bearing date the 10th day of January 1772 and that he contended with Benjamin Wright in the Court of Greene County for the whole quantity of land mentioned in the said Warrant but failed in the suit. If the above draught cannot be accepted in the land office as official Mr. Lowry wishes to be informed of its rejection as he is desirous to apply for a patent shortly
