



David Lewis's Land Situate on the Mill Creek (Being a Branch of Conestoga) Beginning at a Corner Marked White Oak on the South Side of the said Creek and on the West Side of a large Run thence North 72 deg. Easterly 220 perches to a post — thence Nor. by West 201 perches to another white oak thence West by South 400 per. to a Post thence South by East 192 Perches to a Post thence East 186 perches to the Place of Beginning Containing 500 acres with the usual allowance of 6 ¹/₂ Cent for Roads and High Ways — Survey'd the 22^d of April 1719 —

I also Survey'd for the said David Lewis another Tract on the said Mill Creek — Beginning at a Corner Marked Black Oak Standing on the South Side of the Said Creek thence North by East 212 per. to a Post thence East by South 200 per. to a Post thence South South West 216 per. to a Black Oak thence West by North 160 perches to y^e place of Beginning Containing 225 acres with the usual allowance of 6 p^r C. — Survey'd the 23^d of April 1719
