Dr. Sir - Judge Dougherty informed me that before patent could issue there must be a survey made of Warrt dated 1 Aug. 1798, 82 1/2 Acres, so as to set out the 51 1/4 a. marked on private draft, In order to do this I sent to your office for draft, and when I received the same found it quite unlike what I expected - Annexed you have it joined to a draft in our office here, certified from your office - I have roughly shaded the same - You will percieve at a glance how matters are - The fact is the two surveys are entirely differet from the drafts in the possession of Michael Reed - They are however the surveys returned & accepted to the General Office & I presume will answer your purposes for issuing patent - The boundaries outside are all right, I have sent you this connection for your inspection thinking that the draft I sent might have misled you as to the facts. Please return this to me, And in case anything is wanting I will be much obliged if you inform me - Henry Kerr for whom I ask a patent is the man who took Warrant. You will percieve a dotted line that I get from a draft in this office the shape of which is represented by the red lines - that is the draft contg. 51 1/4 a & what I supposed was the Warrt of 1 Aug. 1798
