In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 6<sup>th</sup> of June 1738 requir<sup>d</sup> me to accept & receive the Survey afores<sup>d</sup> & make a Return thereof into the Secretary's Office I have accordingly made a Return of the Same on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June 1738

Samuel Blunston has made a very great mistake in the above description by inverting all the Courses for the line by him called S.W. by W. is N.E. by E. & so of all the rest — this was not discovered till the 17<sup>th</sup> of July 1738 after N. Litle had got his patent — I wrote to Samuel Blunston in order the Same might be corrected & the patent was accordingly sent down & an Indorsement made on the back thereof to correct those C.B. mistakes & the Same also noted in the Records at the Rolls Office.
