



Surveyed on the thirteenth day of June 1754 to Henry Fox a tract of land situate in New Cassischoopin in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at an Elm tree at Corner of Ulrick Englehart's land thence by the same South forty Degrees East seventy perches to a post thence by ye said Ulrick land South West one hundred one hundred perches to a post in the line of a tract of land belonging to ye heirs of Richard Wayne Deed thence by ye same South fifty Degrees West two hundred & twenty three perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East one hundred & thirty five perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East ninety eight perches and by land of Ulrick Englehart the same Course fifty four perches to a post thence by ye same South West Ten perches to ye place of Beginning Containing one hundred & fifty four acres with usual Allowance
