



Sir, The above tract of land was surveyed on the 21st day of Dec^r 1772 by Archibald McLean D^r for William Guffe in pursuance of a Warrant for 150^{ac} dated 15th June 1772. Being employed by Philip Hartzel the present owner to strike off 200^{ac} for a certain purpose I discovered an error in the line marked A of 17 perches as appears by the Records & Draughts in my office as I expect a Return has been made think it my duty to send you a Draught of the whole by the Lines then down (except) a small part adjoining Jacob Shely represented by the Dotted Lines which I left out to accomodate matters between them. Philip Hartzel informs me he searched the General Surveyors Office and no Return was made of the Survey & that finding the Warrant for only 150^{ac} he took out one for 200^{ac} dated 15th Feb^r 1787 to include part of the Land surveyed. Under the Circumstances I have Related have thought it my duty to communicate a State of the Case and wait your Orders if I am to do any thing more in the matter.
