



A Draught of three tracts of Land, situate in Haddonborough Township in the County of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, which were all formerly surveyed for Elias Long Senior, deceased by different warrants granted to him by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries of this Province Dated Octob<sup>r</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> and Nov<sup>r</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> Anno 1734 and May 1<sup>st</sup> 1741 etc. The whole was by the deceased's Heirs conveyed to his son John Jacob Long by their Deed Poll Dated on the 2<sup>nd</sup> March Anno 1760. For the said John Jacob Long, now sold 34 acres out of the 150<sup>th</sup> tract to Martin Koler and kept the Remainder for himself —

So that the first tract contains yet 116 acres et allowance  
 and the second tract " " " " 50<sup>th</sup> " 23<sup>rd</sup> et allowance  
 and the third tract " " " " 30<sup>th</sup> " 11<sup>th</sup> et allowance

Containing together Acres 196 " 34 per et allowance

formerly Resurveyed, and now divided for the said John Jacob Long on the 10<sup>th</sup> November Anno 1780.
