



The above Draft is laid down agreeable to the order of the Board the 11th of June 1801 & explained by the Notes.

Situate in the Township & County of Huntingdon - Containing Two hundred & Ninetytwo Acres Sixty two Perches and the Usual Allowance for Roads - Originally Surveyed on the 8th day of October 1787 & Resurveyed and an Error Corrected on the 9th. day of of December 1800 - The Warrant dated the 14th day of March 1786

Note The Black lines represent the lines originally run and marked The difference between this and the Resurvey arose from an error in the line N 11 E 122 from a B O to a Gum which I found N 11 E 179½ The person who made the Survey If he discovered the Error concealed it from me. The Dotted lines B & C Represents the North Easterly Boundarrys as - Patented according to the Courses & Distances in the first return. The long square A shews that part of the Survey that was Claimed by - John Williams Esquire - The Dotted line dividing the long Square at A was agreed to Between the said John Williams & Benjamin Elliot Esquires - that The said John should hold that part ^{now} marked B and that the part marked A should remain in Sarah Elliotts Survey A & B, contains 17^{ac} each. The following is a Copy of the Agreement

We the Subscribers do Authorise John Canan Deputy Surveyor of Huntingdon County to make return of Sarah Elliotts Survey in such a way as to include one half of the long Square marked A by a parallel line the other half to be continued in John Williams Survey the Parallel line to be dropped from the line S 35 W on the line N 59 E through the said long Square
