(Note) I wish to State, that Daniel Williams obtained a Warrant for The same tract of land the 29th day of May 1848, which was Executed by me the 19 & 20th of March 1849, and Returned, I was aware at the same time of the Cryder Warrant, but knew no owner for it, and knew there was no return of it in the office, therefore I executed Williams Warrant on it, on the 19th of Febr. 1850. Gen^r James Murry presented the above Diagram to me surveyed by John Moore Late D.S. told me he had legal title from the original Warrantee down, and wished me to return the Survey as made by Moore. I am well acquainted with the tract it is unimproved and a very rough Stony Mountain Tract — on the Chestnut Ridge &c in Fairfield township
